Art Smith, chairman of the Recreation Association's golf committee, has scheduled another outing at Churchville on July 21st.

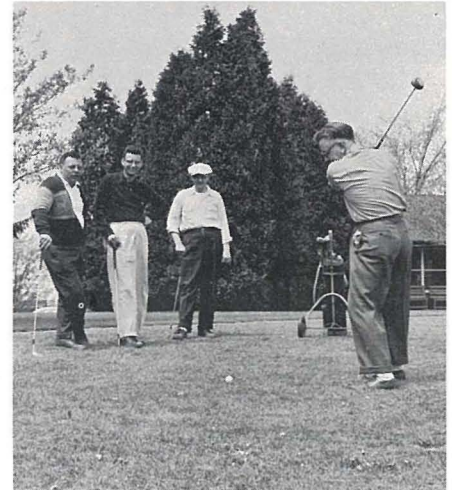
HALOID PEOPLE
